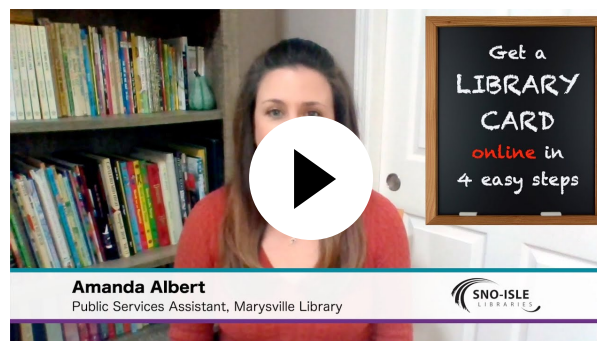
Welcome to the Sno-Isle Libraries Educator Newsletter for teachers and other adults who work with students in grades K-12.
