
Blackout Poetry

Materials: A page from a book or a printed piece of paper with text and a marker

- Quickly scan the page and look for an anchor word- a word that stands out to you
 - Start with your anchor word and use it to think of possible topics and themes
- Read the text of the page
 - With a pencil, lightly circle words that connect to the anchor word
 - Pro-tip: Avoid circling more than three words in one row

- Look at your circled words and decide which ones to keep
 - You can't change the order of the words, but you can eliminate endings or circle connecting words like "if, and, or, but"
 - If your poem isn't working to your satisfaction, scan the page again. The right word might be waiting for you. Or you might need to drop a few words

- Add an illustration or design that relates to the theme of your poem


