Resource Spotlight

Sno-Isle Libraries has digital resources to support teaching and learning during Black History Month and beyond. Here are a few to get started!



Black Freedom Struggle by ProQuest is an excellent resource to browse primary source documents related to critical people and events in African American history.

The goal of the collection is to imbue the study of Black history with a deeper understanding of the humanity of people who have pursued the quest for freedom, and the significance of movements like Black Lives Matter.

Gale in Context: Biography and **Gale in Context: U.S. History** are databases with a similar look and feel that offer in-depth profiles on specific people and credible articles about historical events and time periods.

World Book Timelines allows users to view, create, and share timelines of

important periods and movements, spanning the arts, history, science, and more. Timelines include dates, images, and brief explanations of events.

These resources are free with a library card or student account. Reach out to your local library to learn more!

Book Reviews = Volunteer Hours



The library wants to hear from teen readers!

Teens can submit <u>online book recommendations</u> to earn volunteer hours with Sno-Isle Libraries and to be posted on our website.

Each review should be 2-3 sentences and include:

- 1) what the book is about and
- 2) why you like and recommend it.

Two completed reviews equal one hour of volunteering or community service. Teens may submit up to ten reviews each school year.

Printers & Copiers at the Library



Do your students need to print pictures for a research assignment or make copies for a group project? Sno-Isle Libraries is the place to go!

With a library card or student account, students get \$7.00 of printing credit to use each week. This credit can be used toward black and white or color prints and copies in various paper sizes.

Print jobs can even be submitted remotely through our website, and library staff will prep them for pick up at a local community library. Contact-free pickup is available, too.
