Welcoming Our Community Back

Sno-Isle Libraries is committed to creating inspiring spaces which are welcoming, inclusive, and easy to use. Each community is unique, and our goal is to reimagine our libraries to reflect and align with each community. Our capital projects are a direct investment in our communities.

Darrington Library

The remodeled Darrington Library opened its doors on September 30, 2023. Sno-Isle Libraries invested \$1.5 million in the Darrington community with this project. Our community can now enjoy an outdoor gathering space, designated children's area, and individual and group study spaces.







Edmonds Library

Following a devasting flood in 2022, more than 3,000 people joined us in celebrating the remodeled Edmonds Library on January 13, 2024. Sno-Isle Libraries invested over \$2.5 million in the Edmonds community with this project. Our community has a new meeting room, sightlines to our amazing view, and an interactive children's area.



The Future Lake Stevens Library

The Chapel Hill property was cleared to make way for the new Lake Stevens Library. Sno-Isle Libraries will protect and enhance the wetlands by restoring the buffer space and using native plants.

In 2023, we also engaged our communities and moved plans forward for Arlington Library, Langley Library, and Mariner Community Campus. We will continue to create inviting libraries that support needs now and for years to come.



Celebrate the Freedom to Read

With over 1.6 million items, we have something for everyone. Sno-Isle Libraries recognizes and advocates for the freedom for you to choose books for you and your family. Staff create booklists and personalized recommendations to support your interests and provide opportunities to discover something new.

Language Support on Public Computers

As part of our ongoing commitment to create inclusive library spaces, we added language support for Chinese, Japanese, Korean, Russian, Spanish, and Vietnamese to improve the reading and writing experience on public computers. The public computers also allow you to change accessibility settings such as pointer size and screen contrast.

Prime Time

Sno-Isle Libraries partners with Sno-Isle Libraries Foundation and Humanities Washington to offer Prime Time, a six-week, elementary-age reading program designed to engage, educate, and support children and their families. This bilingual, Spanish and English, program enhances family engagement and develops critical thinking skills for over 1,800 participants.

3rd Graders Read Together


Third Graders Read Together fosters a lifelong love of reading. In 2023, 65 schools in Snohomish and Island counties participated in the program, reaching an estimated 4,200 third graders.

Building Confidence in Young Readers

Sno-Isle Libraries partners with local organizations to provide reading programs where children can boost their confidence and reading skills by reading aloud to a trained therapy dog.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library

Sno-Isle Libraries partnered with United Way of Snohomish County to support Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, which puts books into the hands of young readers.

Building Skills

Your library card helps you build skills with over 24,000 online courses to choose from. Customers enjoyed over 80,000 sessions on LinkedIn Learning.

Custom Reading Lists

You can now request a personalized reading list or movie suggestions based on your interests. Sno-Isle Librarians will help you find your future favorites in any format or genre.

Community Impact

In 2023, the Foundation raised over \$2.5 million to expand the reach and services of Sno-Isle Libraries. This includes a \$1.8 million bequest from the estate of John and Betty Parks to benefit the Snohomish Library.



Advocating for Libraries

Sno-Isle Libraries collaborates with local, county, and state officials to ensure ongoing support for library programs and services. In 2023, library leadership engaged with 12 city and town councils and two county councils to effectively serve our communities' evolving needs.



Expanded Online Newspapers

Customers used their library card to open trusted national news sources like *The New York Times* and *Chicago Tribune*, more than 829,700 times in 2023. Sno-Isle Libraries also added unlimited customer access to articles online for the *Washington Post* and *The Wall Street Journal*.







Free Online Tutors

Students accessed over 13,000 online tutoring sessions. Your library card provides free online tutoring in every subject, seven days a week. Tutors provide support in English and Spanish.

Get Crafty with Creativebug

Sno-Isle Libraries launched Creativebug in 2023, a digital collection of more than one thousand arts and crafts classes. It also includes downloadable templates and patterns. Our community of artists and makers utilized this service more than 6,000 times.

Everyone is welcome at the library. Your community library is a place for discovery. Sno-Isle Libraries staff are available to help you connect with services, uncover something new, and make recommendations.

Investing in Digital Equity

Snohomish County government invested \$1.5 million in Sno-Isle Libraries' digital equity initiative. The funds will add 750 loanable computers with hot spots and expand Sno-Isle Libraries' Digital Navigator Program. All 23 Sno-Isle Libraries provide free Wi-Fi access for communities to browse the internet, as well as assistance from library staff.

The Sno-Isle Libraries' Board of Trustees is a volunteer board of seven trustees representing Snohomish and Island counties. Sno-Isle Libraries' Board of Trustees reaffirmed our commitment to capital projects and equity.
