Ideas from educators participating in the program:

- Create a book club using all or some of the titles.
- Read the books aloud to your class.

- Have students write book reviews.
- Have students read the books together with a buddy.
- Have students keep an OTTER journal.
- Do class research projects based on the OTTER books.
- After the author/illustrator events, invite students to create their own book.
- After the author/illustrator events, invite students to write a letter or create a drawing to send to the author/illustrator.
- Encourage students to vote for their favorite book in May!
- Have a classroom party when the winning book is announced.







Discussion Questions

- 6. How did you feel about Timble's thank you gift to Orris, the butterscotch candy that is top notch and the sweetest? How did you feel when you were reading those pages and why? p. 56-59
- 7. At the end of the story, Orris and Timble become friends. What are some qualities that make a good friend? p. 74-75
- 8. What do you predict will be Orris and Timble's next adventure?

- One of Kate DiCamillo's jobs before becoming an author was working at Walt Disney World.








Discussion Questions

- Shermy and Shake work together to pick enough blackberries for muffins. Have you worked together with a friend to accomplish something? What was it? p. 56-64
- 7. Shake's folks have been gone most of the summer. How do you think that makes Shake feel? How would you feel if you were away from your family for most of the summer? p. 71-73
- 8. Shermy and Shake work together to find an unusual animal for the animal fair. If you could bring any animal in the world to your neighborhood animal fair, what animal would it be? Why did you pick that animal? p. 76-80
- 9. Shermy and Shake sure had a fun summer getting to know each other and going on adventures. It's sad that Shake is finally headed home. On the last page we learn that Shake is moving soon! Where do you think he's moving? p. 81-86

















Discussion Questions
